About Fisher

- Two genetically distinct populations:
 Boreal and Central Interior
- Wide-ranging species
- Use specific habitat features across a mosaic of landscapes, including latesuccessional forests for denning and resting
- Sensitive to landscape modifications
- Been studied for 30+ years

Fisher Status

Boreal Population

- Blue-listed
- Future Trends Anticipate decline by 10-30 %
- Management options remain can be pro-active

Central Interior Population

- February 2020 elevated to red-listed by BC CDC
- ~90% decline since pre-contact
- Future trends: Anticipated further decline by 30-70%



Province of BC Response

Since 2009

- Fisher Habitat Extension Program (www.BCFisherHabitat.ca)
 - Information about fishers and tools to support industry and others to enhance fisher habitat
 - Encourages voluntary adoption of strategies to support fisher been implemented with mixed results

Under Development

- Proposed regulation change for the Central Interior fisher population
- Landscape Planning Tools: support for large-scale habitat management decisions

New

- Fisher Management and Recovery Planning
- Provincial-Federal pilot project: use fisher to explore opportunities to improve species at risk management

Fisher Management and Recovery Planning: Phased Approach for Engagement

- 1. Introduce the project
- 2. Exchange of information about fishers with those who have local knowledge
- 3. Collaborate with ongoing initiatives to:
 - Identify synergies and conflicts with other species and values
 - Explore how fisher management and recovery can help design solutions to broader challenges
- 4. Flexible engagement to:
 - Identify questions to be pursued through management and recovery planning
 - Develop strategic direction for management and recovery
- 5. Collaborate with relevant initiatives on implementation of the strategic direction to support coordinated, integrated responses across multiple values
