M-KMA Act

■ The Muskwa-Kechika Management Area Act was created in 1997 and enacted in 1998

 Establishes purpose and objectives of the area, management plan, local strategic plans plus establishment of Trust Fund

■ Reference to an Advisory Board and its role of providing advice to Government on management of the M-KMA.





Activities within the area must be consistent with the management plan.

Management Plan is the collective LRMP's of Fort Nelson, Fort St. John and Mackenzie.





■ Any amendments or changes to the Management Plan requires consultation with the Board.





An Advisory Board, appointed by the Premier, will advise government on natural resource management in the Muskwa-Kechika Management Area to ensure that activities within the area are <u>consistent with the</u> <u>objectives of the Muskwa-Kechika Management Plan</u> (Part 2, Section 2.1, Management Regulation)



M-KMA ACT PREAMBLE (excerpts)

- maintain in perpetuity wilderness quality and the diversity and abundance of wildlife and the ecosystems on which it depends
- while allowing resource development and use in parts of the Muskwa-Kechika Management Area designated for those purposes including
 - : recreation,
 - : hunting,
 - : trapping,
 - : timber harvesting,
 - : mineral exploration and mining, and
 - : oil and gas exploration and development



M-KMA ACT PREAMBLE (excerpts)

...the long-term maintenance of wilderness
characteristics, wildlife and its habitat is critical to the
social and cultural well-being of first nations and other people in the area;





...the integration of management activities especially related to the planning, development and management of road accesses...is central to achieving this intent and the long-term objective is to return lands to their natural state as development activities are completed;





- Identifies Local Strategic Plans.
- Local Strategic Plans must be consistent with the Management Plan.





- ► Local Strategic Plans that must be consistent with the Management Plan and require Board advice are:
 - : Landscape Unit Objectives
 - : Pre-Tenure Plans
 - : Recreation Management Plans
 - : Park Management Plans
 - : Wildlife Management Plans





■ Absence of Local Strategic Plans? Operations must be consistent with the Management Plan.







M-KMA Regulation



Gives effect to the Advisory Board and its roles and responsibilities

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- The Premier must appoint an advisory board, to be known as the Muskwa-Kechika Advisory Board, to advise on natural resource management in the management area and may appoint a chair of the advisory board (Part 3, Section 9 of Act).
- The Premier will appoint up to 17 members... represents a broad range of interests
- Currently 13 members but 2 appointments are vacant.





- Gives effect to a Letter of Understanding, dated September 24, 1997, establishes an agreement between the Kaska Dena Council and the Province of British Columbia regarding the Muskwa-Kechika Management Area.

- 4 Board position reserved for Kaska Members.





Describes high level direction of local strategic plans:

- definition, establishment, varied or cancellation
- Approval of these plans
- Requirements for these plans
- Exceptions to requirements (O&G permits for geophysical exploration, addressing wildfire or pest or disease infestation to forests or wildlife



Board Roles and Responsibilities







- Conducting semi-annual reviews...of operational activities...Looking to reinstate.
- Reporting, at least annually, to the public and the Premier...Now done electronically.
- Providing advice to the Inter-Agency Management Committee...Looking to reinstate.





Facilitating provincial, national and international exposure of the values and management of the Muskwa-Kechika Management Area...Done via our website.

Recommending and implementing measures to raise money for a Muskwa-Kechika Fund...Do not have expertise.





- Reviewing proposals and funding requests for, but not limited to, research projects; and making recommendations for expenditures from the Muskwa-Kechika Fund...Done through Partnership with UNBC.
- Ensuring adequate public consultation in the preparation and approval of local strategic plans, amendments to the Muskwa-Kechika Management Plan, any other significant policy issue for the Muskwa-Kechika Management Area, or as requested by the Inter-Agency Management Committee... Has not happened for a long time.





Providing recommendations to the Environment and Land Use Committee on any proposed amendments to the Management Plan... Examining how to reinstate with new ministry re-structuring.



Board Membership & Composition

- Scientific, financial or community service experience and expertise.
- Advisory Board appointments/re-appointments will be for a period of 1 to 3 years.
- Staggered to provide continuity of Board operations
