## What is the North Area Wildlife Strategy?

- Development of a principled, coordinated approach to Wildlife Management
- Create opportunities for sharing resources and coordination of effort across Ministries (MoF, WLRS) and North Area regions (Peace, Omineca, Skeena)
- Develop a strategy for wildlife co-management consistent with existing commitments and Together for Wildlife (T4W)
- Identify and prioritize policy challenges



## Why NAWS?

## Ensure coordination and common approaches to wildlife co-management across the north

- Support development of joint objectivesetting processes
- Via Regional Wildlife Advisory Committees (RWACs)
- Collection of trusted information that inform decision-making
- Updated information and inventory plans



## 2024 Hunting and Trapping Regulation Change Process

- Coordination of regulation change process across North Area regions (Peace, Omineca, Skeena)
- Principled approach
- Clear objectives
- Measurable
- Regional support/recommendations
- All proposals were shared in one package to First Nations and stakeholders
- Opportunity to explore implications with a broader lens
